# Men's Club Founder Al Fuchs

**N**orth Shore Towers Men's Club founder and former Bd. of Director's candidate Al Fuchs died on Tuesday, December 15th from cancer. He was 77.

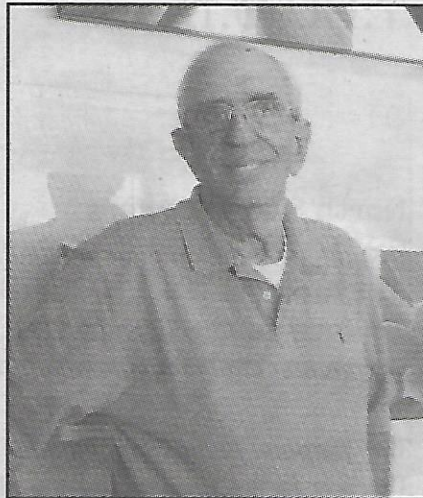
The Building Three resident managed, organized and restructured many business corporations, as well as NYC departments and agencies for over 35 years.

"I am most proud of the fact that I am the founder of our Men's Club," Fuchs said in a recent interview. "I saw a need, and am happy to say, we now have over 110 members. We are well organized and offer numerous activities. We have an interactive web site accessible to all residents."

Fuchs explained that his idea for a Men's Club at North Shore Towers came to him while he was in his winter home in Florida. He originally hoped for a showing of 20 men at the first meeting, which was held in a small area within the Coleridge Lounge. About 25-30 people showed up, and the group quick-

ly outgrew the space. He said he never dreamed the group would grow to its present size.

Fuchs was also an experienced Canasta teacher, and veteran of a 13-year continuous Tuesday night men's Canasta game. In 2012 he married Marilyn Salzman, whom he also taught the game.
